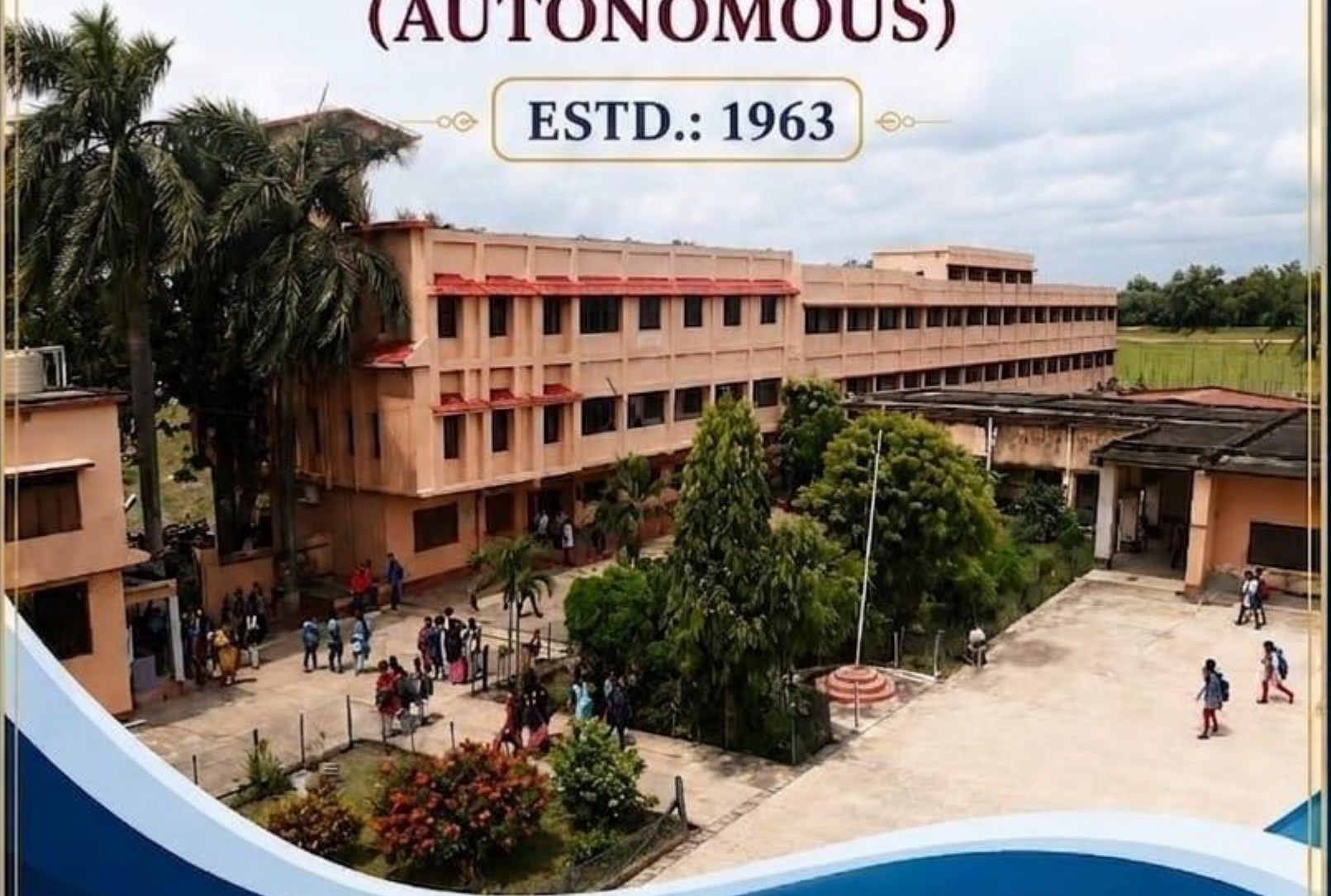

Founded in 1963, Bhatler College, Dantan emerged from a collective aspiration to expand access to higher education in a historically underserved region. Established through the philanthropic vision of Sri Mathuranath Bhatler and the pioneering leadership of Smt. Abha Maity, the institution was conceived not merely as a centre of learning, but as an instrument of intellectual awakening and social transformation. Over the decades, the college has evolved into a respected institution serving generations of students from Dantan and neighbouring areas.

Situated within the historic cultural landscape of Dandabhukti, once a significant centre of trade, pilgrimage, and scholarly exchange, the college draws inspiration from a syncretic intellectual tradition rooted in openness, dialogue, and integrative learning. This heritage continues to shape its academic ethos and institutional values.

Bhatler College has steadily achieved academic distinction through milestones such as NAAC Grade 'B+' accreditation in 2007, recognition by the UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence in 2009, and the award of NAAC Grade 'A' in 2015, reaffirmed again in 2023. The conferment of Autonomous Status in 2024 marked a transformative phase, enabling greater academic flexibility, pedagogical innovation, and research-oriented growth.

Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college promotes multidisciplinary, learner-centred, and skill-integrated education through experiential learning, ICT-enabled teaching, and continuous assessment practices. Guided by its motto, "सत्यम् ज्ञानम् अनन्तम्" (Truth, Knowledge, Infinity), Bhatler College remains committed to intellectual integrity, ethical values, critical inquiry, and social responsibility while engaging with contemporary global concerns such as sustainability, equity, and responsible governance.

A Brief Profile of the College

Bhatter College, Dantan is an undergraduate, coeducational college situated at Dantan, a rural centre in the district of Paschim Medinipur, West Bengal (Coordinates: 21.933947°N, 87.279402°E) on the South-western border between West Bengal and Orissa. The college is located amidst a very charming sylvan natural setting with the river Subarnarekha flowing past the region on the western side. The region beyond the river on the western side is Jungle Mahal with thick forests and tribal resources. The Bay of Bengal lies about 50 km away from Dantan.

Brief History of Bhatter College, Dantan (Autonomous)

Established on December 5, 1963, Bhatter College owes its inception to the philanthropy of Sri Mathuranath Bhatter, who donated ₹1,01,101 for its construction. Supported by local contributions and a dedicated first Governing Body led by Miss Ava Maity and Sri Prodyot Kumar Mohanty, the college began as a grassroots educational movement.

The early years saw foundational growth under the first permanent Principal, Birendra Nath Ghosal, who introduced Bengali and Political Science majors in the mid-1960s. During the 1970s, the leadership of Governing Body President Dr. Santosh Kumar Bhattacharyya proved pivotal, leading to the introduction of B. Com courses in 1979.

A transformative era began in June 2003 with the arrival of Principal Dr. Pabitra Kumar Mishra. His "silent revolution" overhauled the campus infrastructure and support services. Under his guidance, the college achieved NAAC 'B+' accreditation in 2007, was declared a UGC "College with Potential for Excellence" in 2010, and ultimately reached 'A' Grade status in 2015 and 2023 successively. Dr. Mishra's legacy includes establishing a private ITI, reviving the Sarasanka Lake, and earning the state's Siksha Ratna Award.

Following Dr. Mishra's retirement in 2023, the institution saw brief transitions under Prof. Tarun Tapas Mukherjee, Dr. Pijus Kanti Khatua and again Dr. Tarun Tapas Mukherjee. On November 18, 2025, Prof. (Dr.) Giridhari Panda assumed the role of Principal. Today, Dr. Panda continues the college's long-standing mission of expansion and academic excellence, building upon a legacy of social service and rural empowerment.

Institutional Vision and Mission

Vision:

By offering high-quality, all-encompassing education, fostering moral and ethical values, and equipping students from all walks of life with employable skills as they develop into responsible members of the community and nation, this college hopes to become one of the top educational establishments.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Governing Body has constituted the IQAC to maintain and advise the staff and management on the quality assurance process. The IQAC discusses things related to academic, administrative and financial management and recommends its proposal to the Principal for taking action in consultation with the concerned departments/authority. The IQAC also processes the Career Advancement Schemes of teachers.

Functions of the IQAC:

The IQAC of Bhatler College attempts to impart quality education through its innovative, comprehensive, and flexible educational policy. Its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) carries out activities that encompass all aspects of the Institute's functioning.

1. Providing inputs for the Academic and Administrative Audit and analysis of results for improvement in areas found weak.
2. The IQAC prepares, evaluates and recommends the following for approval by the relevant statutory authorities: 1. Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR), Performance-Based Appraisal System (PBAS) for Career Advancement Scheme (CAS).
3. Discussions and webinars are conducted regularly as per the National Education Policy 2020.
4. The IQAC planned, organized and executed the necessary steps that included the preparation of detailed quality manuals, identification of key performance indicators and mapping the various processes across the entire functioning of the Institute.
5. The IQAC also monitor the financial transparency through internal and external audit.

Infrastructure

With a total area of 40468.6 square meters and a built-up area of 8,400 square meters, the college is housed in ten buildings. The entire College Office is computerized. Nearly every department has its own departmental offices, libraries, labs, major topic classrooms, and ICT facilities. The Central Library is housed in a separate building and is run by a full-time librarian. It features a computer centre, an auditorium,



a seminar hall, an indoor and outdoor stadium, an open stage called "Abha Maity Open Stage," common rooms for boys and girls, a car shelter, two playgrounds, gardens, and a pond. The Multimedia Support Centre, Language Lab, and E-Library all have their own rooms. It also features a Constitution Club, a Sports Academy, a Centre for Women's Health, a Centre for Yoga, and a Centre for Performance Studies. Our College Health Centre offers free primary healthcare to both staff and students. In light of the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020's emphasis on research, we have created a Research Centre. The ITI is housed in a different structure. There are two hostels: one for girls and one for boys. To manage the load, the college has a dedicated transformer and a separate electric connection. All of the college's departments have broadband internet connections, several inverters, intercom facilities, and two diesel generators that serve as a power backup system. Internet connectivity is free for both staff and students. In addition, our campus now has a 10 Kv solar power plant, a waste management system, rainwater harvesting, and a solar energy system.

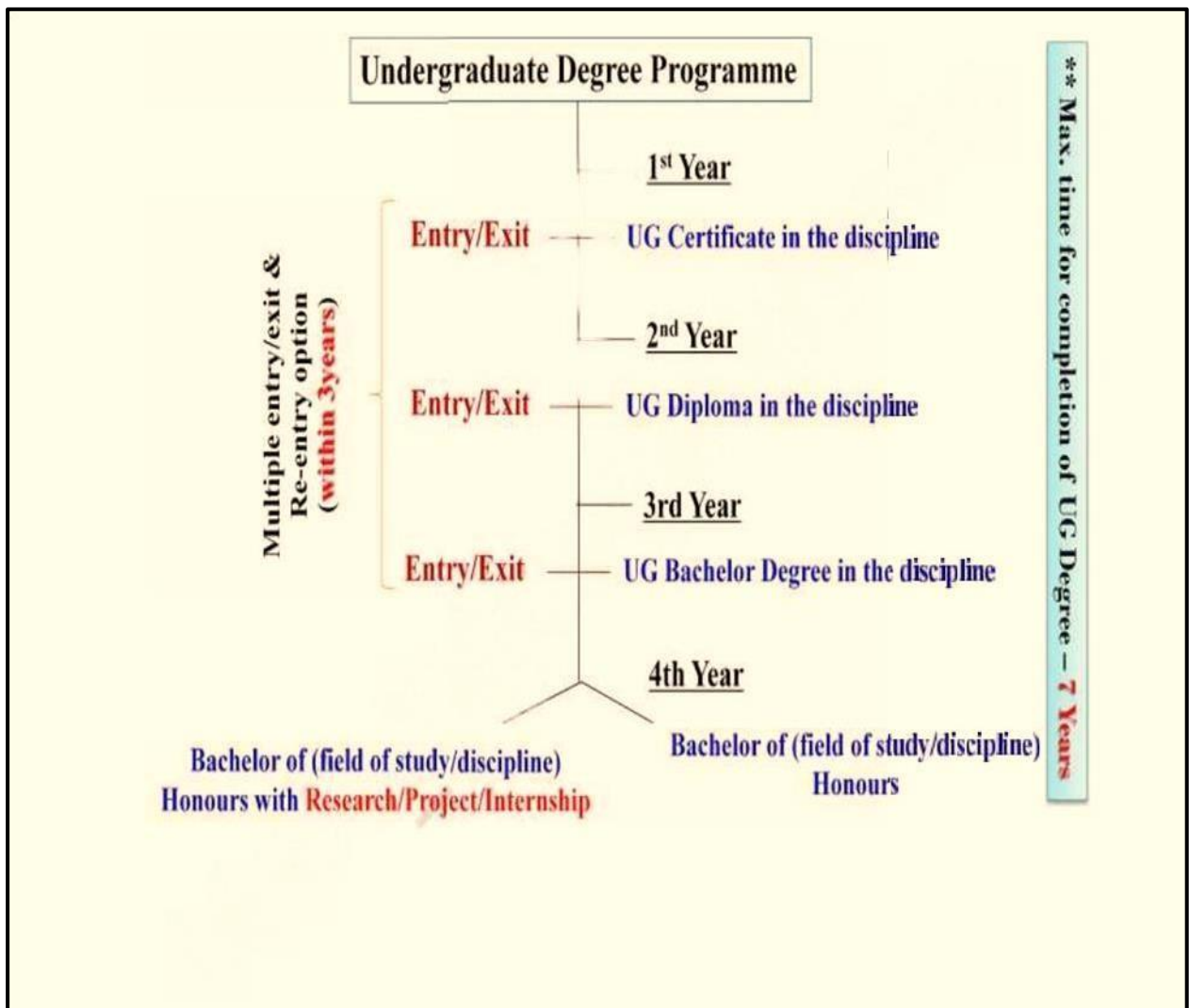

- b) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours) with Major in Science/ Arts/ Commerce field of studies (8 semesters with 172 Credits)
- c) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) with Major in Science/ Arts / Commerce field of studies (8 semesters with 172 Credits) - *Students to complete research project of 12 Credits in their major area(s) of study in the 4th Year of studies.*

Multidisciplinary programmes:

- d) 3-year Bachelor's degree with Multidisciplinary programme of studies in Life Science/ Physical Science / Mathematical & Computer Sc./ Social Sc./ Humanities (6 semesters with 132 credits)

Types of Awards with Stage of Exit (for all programmes):

- UG Certificate after completing 1 year of study (2 semesters with 40 Credits + Community Service of 4 credits)
- UG Diploma after 2 years of study (4 semesters with 84 Credits)
- Bachelor's degree after 3-years of study (6 semesters with 132 credits including Internship/Apprenticeship/project of 4 credits)
- Bachelor's degree (Honours) after 4-year (8 semesters with 172 Credits)
- Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) after 4-year (8 semesters with 172 Credits) - student to complete research project of 12 Credits) in their major area(s) of study.

The eligibility condition of doing the UG degree (Honours with Research) is- minimum 75% marks to be obtained in the first six semesters.

Note: As recommended in the CCFUP guideline, criteria for offering Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) are to have the facilities - Library, access to journals, computer lab, laboratory facilities for research work and at least two permanent faculty members recognized as PhD supervisors. Colleges satisfying the above criteria may offer the Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) programme.

Admission of students commences as soon as the results of the Higher Secondary Examination are declared by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education.

Details about the Admission Rules and Regulations can be found at the college website at www.bhattercollege.ac.in.

The students are admitted strictly on the basis of merit. The merit is determined as per the following rules prescribed by the University.

Students who pass Higher Secondary or equivalent examination (10+2) with a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate (to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in “Best Four” subjects) or 45% marks in the subject or related subject are eligible to apply for admission in the Major course.

- Students carrying pass marks in at least five subjects are eligible to apply for admission to Multidisciplinary courses.
- Admission is done on a merit basis. The Merit point for admission in the major course is calculated by adding 10% of total marks obtained in the ‘Best Four’ subjects at higher secondary/ equivalent examination and the marks obtained in the subject or a related subject in which the admission in major course is sought.
- Merit point for admission in Multidisciplinary Course is calculated by adding the marks obtained in ‘Best Four’ subjects at higher secondary/equivalent examination.
- For admission in Multidisciplinary and Major course, a student must have passed in two language subjects of which one must be English at Higher Secondary/Equivalent examination.
- Any candidate seeking admission with Economics (Hons.) or Accountancy (Hons.) must have obtained 45% marks in mathematics in the Madhyamik/equivalent examination or must have passed in Mathematics in Higher Secondary / Equivalent Examination.
- Students passing Higher Secondary Examination from Vocational stream, conducted by W.B.S.C.T&V Education or any other equivalent Board/Council may apply for admission in Multidisciplinary course only.
- Vidyasagar University has introduced the CBSC System for the students of B.Sc. (Hons.), B.A. (Hons.) and B.Com. (Hons.) students.

Selection Process for Admission

1. For the students of Vidyasagar University and autonomous college(s) affiliated to Vidyasagar University (80% seat)

- Selection will be made strictly on the basis of marks obtained in the concerned CGPA. In case of equal CGPA, the immediately preceding Examination is to be considered for ranking.
- As per the order of the Govt. of West Bengal, 80% of the total seats in each subject will be reserved for the students of Vidyasagar University and autonomous college(s) affiliated to Vidyasagar University.
- Quota for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/EWS will be considered as per Govt. rules. The number of seats (SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B & EWS) will be calculated and considered separately for 80% of the seats and 20% of the seats for the Open Competition. Fractions of 0.5% or more will be rounded to the next whole number.
- 5% of each category (Gen/SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/EWS) will be reserved for Differently Abled Persons (DAP) candidates.
- Normally, 80% seats will be for the students of the Vidyasagar University.
- These percentages of 80% and 20% may be relaxed in cases of non-availability of applicants in either category.

2. Seats for other universities, including Vidyasagar University and Autonomous Colleges under Vidyasagar University (20% of Total Seats)

- The Common Entrance Test will not be conducted for admission to PG for the academic session 2023-2024. 20% of the total seats are reserved for the students of other Universities/Institutions

- a. Percentage of marks obtained in UG(Hons.) (Part – I, Part-II & Part-III taking together) for the annual system,
a. OR
- b. Equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA, in case of the semester (CBCS) system.
- c. In case of a tie, marks obtained in the immediately preceding Examinations are to be considered for ranking.
- ii) Minimum 45% marks are required for the General Category to apply for admission in Bengali/Education/English/History (20% seat), and minimum 40% marks are required for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/DAP candidates.
- 3. The admission will be held as per the Rules and Regulations framed by the Vidyasagar University and the Government of West Bengal.**
- 4. Online provisional admission will be done based on the merit list, thus published through the college PG admission portal.**
- 5. The verification of testimonials & other documents for provisionally admitted students will be initiated after completion of the admission process.**
- 6. The admission will be cancelled if a student remains absent from classes for a consecutive ten days from the date of admission without any intimation to the Principal/concerned Head for PG studies.**

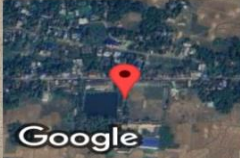

The College has four NSS units with teachers as Programme Officers. The Units function towards the attainment of the following objectives:

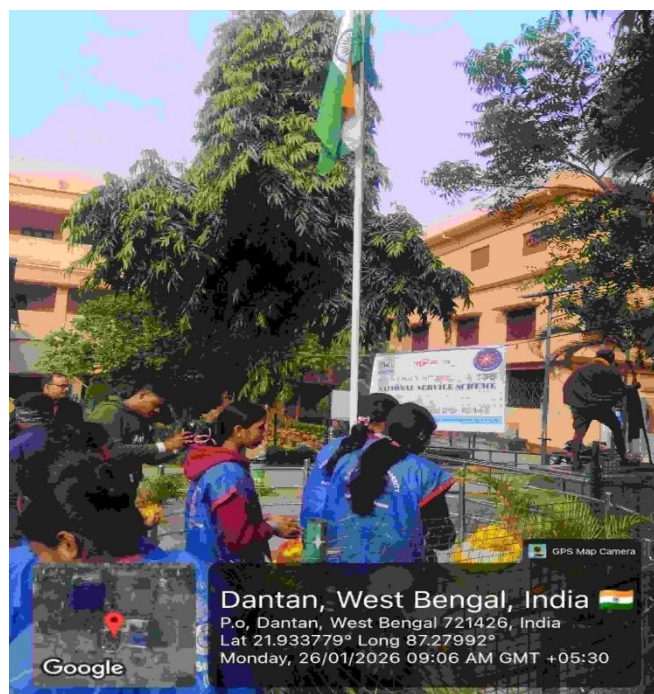
- To encourage students to participate in social welfare activities
